Scott Owens, New EM Global Health Fellow

The new EM Global Health fellow, Scott Owens, will begin his fellowship in July 2017 in Alaska. Scott Owens will complete residency this summer from UCSF-Fresno, where he was heavily involved in remote EMS through the National Park Service and Paramedic Program. His interest in global health stems from time spent in Lebanon and Syria during the 2006 conflict in Lebanon, and he hopes to pursue a focus in acute humanitarian disasters.

Jodie is currently working in the Emergency Departments of Alaska Native Medical Center (Anchorage) and Norton Sound Health Corporation (Nome, Alaska). She is also working in other clinics in Koyuk, Savoonga (St. Lawrence Island), Unalakleet in conjunction with local Community Health Aids. These are settings where there isn't usually a doctor but one comes in (Jodie in this case) every few months to see patients and lives in the clinic while doing so. She also participates in continuing education workshops in Nome for intraosseous access and point of care ultrasound.
